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


## Rolling Stones Quilt Class December 8, 2025 @ 10 a.m.

No need to get "all strung out" when making a quilt. Join us in making a one-of-a-kind String Quilt. You will learn how to make 3 types of string blocks to assemble and make this beautiful quilt. Note: Lunch will be on your own.

Finished Quilt Size: Approximately 63" x 78"

Class Size: Minimum 8 Maximum: 15

#### Skills to be Taught:

1. marking stabilizer squares for string placement

- 2. making solid string blocks with diagonal strings
- 3. making half-square triangle blocks with diagonal strings
- 4. making solid string blocks with straight strings
- squaring completed string blocks

Kit Fee: \$30 (includes Spiral Bound Pattern & Packet of Stabilizer – 75+ count 6 ½" x 6 ½")

#### Basic Supplies List for Class:

-sewing machine, foot pedal, & power supply -container for storing strings/strips

-extra sewing machine needles -6 ½" x 6 ½" square-up ruler -thread & extra wound bobbins -5 ½" x 5 ½" square-up ruler

-rotary cutter & blades -straight pins

-ultra fine tip permanent marker...red or black -extension cord(s)

-washable glue stick -rotating cutting mat if you have one

-fabric scissors -seam ripper

-¼" foot with guide -6" x 18" ruler or larger

-heat erasing ink pen (black, blue, or red) -white marking pencil & sharpener if using

dark background fabric

<u>Fabrics Required</u>: \*Background and inner border fabrics are the same color in the quilt shown on the of the pattern.

Background Fabric 1 ¼ yds\* Binding 2/3 yds

Inner Border ½ yd\* Backing 5 yds (Width of Fabric 42")

Middle Border ½ yd Batting TWIN

Outer Border 1 1/3 yds

Fat Quarters or Cut 21 to 23 Fat Quarter into strings/strips (approximately 5 ½ to 6 yds).

¼ yds or This number of Fat Quarter's or ¼ yds allows for an ample variety of

Yardage or fabric strings/strips for your quilt blocks.

Scraps

There will be leftover strings/strips after piecing your quilt.

#### **Preparing for Class:**

1. Have a variety of your strings cut. Not all will need to be cut for class.

From your chosen fabrics cut strings/strips 1", 1¼", 1½", 1¾", and 2" wide. The length of each strip will vary depending on whether you are using FQ's, ¼ yds., or scraps. Keep your 2" strings/strips separated from your other strips/strips. You will use the 2" strings/strips to make the solid string blocks with vertical strings later in the pattern. Place all strings/strips in your storage container.



- 2. Cut (24) 6 ½" x 6 ½" squares from your Background Fabric.
- 3. Cut (12) 5 ½" x 5 ½" squares from your Background Fabric.



#### **Dream Weaver String Quilt Class**

Finished Quilt Size: Approximately 66" x 84"

Class Size: Minimum 08 Maximum: 20

#### Skills to be Taught:

1. understanding terminology used in making the string blocks

- 2. marking stabilizer squares for string placement
- 3. sewing the strings onto the marked stabilizer squares
- 4. adjusting for strings not parallel to the drawn reference lines
- 5. squaring the completed string blocks
- 6. using the Dream Weaver Ruler to cut off opposing corner triangles
- 7. adding solid fabric triangles to the trimmed string block
- 8. squaring the string blocks with the added fabric triangles
- 9. assembling the squares to make the quilt
- adding borders

**Kit Fee: \$40** includes Spiral Bound Pattern (\$15), Stabilizer Packet 50 count (\$12), & Dream Weaver Ruler (\$13)

#### **Basic Supplies Needed for Class:**

sewing machine, foot pedal, & power cord

- extra sewing machine needles

- thread and extra loaded bobbins

rotary cutter & blades

- <u>ultra fine tip</u> black or red permanent marker

- washable glue stick

- scissors

- 1/4" presser foot with guide

- 9 1/2" x 9 1/2" square-up ruler

- container for storing strings/strips

- Dream Weaver String Quilt Ruler

- straight pins

extension cord

- iron & ironing pad

- rotating cutting mat if you have one

seam ripper

- 6" x 18" quilting ruler

<u>Fabrics Required</u>: \* Background and outer border are the same color in the quilt shown on the front of the pattern.

Background Fabric – 1 ½ yds.\*

Backing – 5 ½ yds.

Inner Border Fabric - 1/2 yd.

Batting – twin size

Outer Border Fabric – 1 ¼ yds.\*


Binding – 2/3 yd.

Fat Quarters, ¼ yds., Yardage, or scraps – 24 to 26 FQ's (approximately 6 to 6 ½ yds)

#### **Preparing for Class:**

1. Have a variety of strings cut. NOT all strings will need to be cut for class.

From your chosen fabrics cut strings/strips 1",  $1 \frac{1}{4}$ ",  $1 \frac{1}{2}$ ",  $1 \frac{3}{4}$ ", and 2" in width. The Strings can then be sub cut into  $10 \frac{1}{2}$ " lengths. Place the cut strings/strips into your storage container.



2. Cut (8) 6 1/2" Width of Fabric (WOF) strips from your 1 1/2 yds. of background fabric.



3. Sub cut <u>each</u> of those (8) 6  $\frac{1}{2}$ " strips into (6) 6  $\frac{1}{2}$ " squares. You should have (48) 6  $\frac{1}{2}$ " squares of background fabric. Sub cut each of the (48) 6  $\frac{1}{2}$ " x 6  $\frac{1}{2}$ " squares into (2) triangles as shown below. There will be a total of (96) triangles.

#### **BABY QUILT**

For a "Baby Quilt"
measuring 36" x 36", you
would typically need around
140–160 inches of binding.
This translates to
approximately 1.3 to 1.5
yards of fabric for the
binding, assuming you're
using standard 2.5-inchwide binding strips.

#### THROW QUILT


For a "Throw Quilt" measuring 60" x 72", you would typically need around 240–270 inches of binding. This translates to approximately 2.2 to 2.5 yards of fabric for the binding, assuming you're using standard 2.5—inch—wide binding strips.

#### TWIN QUILT

For a "Twin Quilt" measuring 70" x 90", you would typically need around 320–350 inches of binding. This translates to approximately 2.9 to 3.2 yards of fabric for the binding, assuming you're using standard 2.5-inch-wide binding strips.

#### FULL /DOUBLE

For a "Full/Double Quilt"
measuring 85" x 108", you
would typically need around
388-420 inches of binding.
This translates to
approximately 3.5 to 3.8
yards of fabric for the
binding, assuming you're using
standard 2.5-inch-wide
binding strips.

#### QUEEN QUILT

For a "Queen Quilt" measuring 90" x 90", you would typically need around 360-380 inches of binding. This translates to approximately 3.3 to 3.5 yards of fabric for the binding, assuming you're using standard 2.5-inch-wide binding strips.

#### KING QUILT

For a "King Quilt" measuring 108" x 108", you would typically need around 432–460 inches of binding. This translates to approximately 4 to 4.2 yards of fabric for the binding, assuming you're using standard 2.5-inch-wide binding strips.

#### **BRUSCHETTA** DIP

#### **INGREDIENTS**

- For the Bruschetta
  - 4 Roma tomatoes cored, seeded, & chopped small
  - o 1/4 c. fresh basil leaves chopped
  - 1 clove garlic minced
  - 1 Tbsp. EVOO
  - 1-2 tsp. Balsamic vinegar
  - o pinch of salt
- For the Cheese Mixture
  - · 8 oz. feta cheese block crumbled
  - 4 oz. cream cheese softened
  - ½ c. sour cream
  - 1 clove garlic minced
  - 1 Tbsp. freshly squeezed lemon juice
  - 1 Tbsp. EVOO
  - o pinch of salt

#### INSTRUCTIONS

- 1. Place cored, seeded, & chopped tomatoes in a medium bowl. Add chopped basil and minced garlic. Drizzle EVOO and balsamic vinegar, then sprinkle with pinch of salt. Toss gently to combine making sure tomatoes are evenly coated. Set aside.
- 2.In food processor, combine crumbled feta, cream cheese, sour cream, minced garlic, lemon juice, and EVOO. Puree 3-4 minutes until smooth & creamy, scraping down sides of bowl if needed.
- 3. Put cheese in shallow serving dish, spreading it evenly. With slotted spoon, top cheese mixture with tomatoes, covering the cheese. Garnish with fresh basil leaves, red pepper flakes, or freshly grated Parmesan.
